WHAT & WHEN

Friday 28th February Rare Disease Day but we encourage you to show your stripes on whatever shifts you may be working the week commencing Monday 24th onwards!

WHO All healthcare teams including clinicians, allied HCPs and healthcare students. And everyone else!

WHERE Anywhere you are working or studying! Wards / clinics / theatres / surgeries / waiting rooms/ offices / common rooms / on campus / etc!

WHY Rare diseases are individually rare but collectively common, affecting 3.5 million people in the UK.

Patients wait an average of five years for a final diagnosis. Raising awareness of rare disease, amongst healthcare professionals, is key to a timely diagnosis and better outcomes.

Medics for Rare Disease is working with the Department of Health and Social Care. Raising HCP awareness is listed as a key priority in the Department's Rare Disease Action Plan. Marking Rare Disease Day in hospitals is an important part of the strategy.

Why the stripes? The zebra was adopted as a symbol by the rare disease community. This is thanks to the old medical adage 'when you hear hooves, think horse not zebra'. It still impacts clinical decision making today.
